2.2 Front Panel I/O & Functions

In Vecow IVH-9200 series family, all I/O connectors are located on front panel and rear panel. Most of the general connections to computer device, such as USB, LAN Jack, Audio, Display Port, DVI-I, DVI-D and any additional storage, are placed on the front panel.



2.2.1 Power Button




The Power Button is a non-latched switch with dual color LED indication. It indicates power status: S0, S3 and S5. More detail LED indications are listed as follows:



(For example, once turning off the system, you have to wait for 4 seconds to initiate another power-on operation.)




Figure 4 3-9: Intel TXT Information




Figure 4-4-1: System Agent Settings




Figure 4-4-5: PCH-IO Settings




Figure 4-4-7: BIOS Security Settings




Figure 4-4-8: RAID ROM Settings




Figure 4-4-9: GPIO Manager Settings




Figure 4-6: BIOS Boot Menu


